

TAKE CARE

If you sand or scrape paint from a house built before 1978, be warned: Older coats of paint might contain lead, so you'll need to take extra precautions. In fact, federal law now requires that painters you hire be certified by the Environmental Protection Agency and trained in lead-safe work practices.

TOP PICKS FROM CONSUMER REPORTS

Exterior Paint

Manufacturers tend to reformulate exterior paints and stains often, partly to meet tougher federal standards limiting volatile organic compounds (VOCs), which can cause headaches and dizziness. and are linked to pollution, smog, and respiratory problems. In our tests, we simulated conditions to see how exterior paints would look after three, six, and nine years. (The last time frame is about how long most homeowners go between paint jobs.) Most paints held up well for the equivalent of at least three years, and the best still looked fine after nine.

CONSUMER REPORTS' TOP-RATED FLAT EXTERIOR PAINT

BEHR PREMIUM PLUS ULTRA FLAT ENAMEL (HOME DEPOT)

\$37 (per gal.)

This self-priming paint boasted impressive appearance after the equivalent of nine years outdoors, plus resistance to cracking, color change, dirt, and mildew. It's well below the federal VOC limits.

After three and six years of simulated weather effects, this paint still looked excellent, and very good after nine. It stood up well to cracking, color change, and mildew, but not dirt.



COLOR THEORY

How often have you found that a color that looks great on the chip is a miss once you get it up on the wall? Here's how to minimize fuss and expense by getting it right the first time:

Keep room size in mind. Color intensifies over large areas, so it's better to go too light than too dark in a given shade. Or you may want to use a bold color on just one wall.

Consider the lighting. Fluorescent light enhances blues and greens, but it dulls warm reds, oranges, and yellows. Incandescent light works better with warm colors than with cool tones.


Pick the right white. Pure whites have a bluish hue in certain lights. Warmer whites are easier to live with and to mix with other colors.

See the whole picture. If you use a bold color in one room, carry it into the surrounding living areas, perhaps as an accent wall or in a less saturated version. The repetition of color helps connect the spaces and makes each one feel more expansive.

Use in-store tools. Most chain retailers and paint stores sell sample jars, so you can try out a color before making a major investment. Most manufacturers also offer large color chips, which are easier to use than the conventional small swatches. In-store computer programs also let you view colors under various types of light.

Explore interactive helpers. Home Depot has a free smart-phone app that lets you mix and match colors before making a selection. Most of the major paint brands also offer a host of similar digital tools.

Try sample colors on the wall. Be sure to use different walls—the same color may look different in different exposures—and at various times of day. Paint practice boards (cardboard sheets finished with a simulated flat white finish), then hang them up (painter's tape works well for this) on each wall for a day or two to see how the color will look under the various light conditions of the room.

TOP PICKS FROM CONSUMER REPORTS

Interior Paint

All of the paints we test are latex-based. A battery of tests revealed how well each product hid the paint below, as well as its surface smoothness, whether the gloss level changed, and whether it could withstand stains and scrubbing. Our testers evaluated resistance to mildew, sticking, and fading, along with its volatile organic compound (VOC) level. Almost all of the paints in our tests are claimed to be low- or no-VOC. None contains more than 50 grams of VOCs per liter.



CONSUMER REPORTS' TOP-RATED SATIN AND EGGSHELL PAINT

BEHR PREMIUM PLUS ULTRA SATIN ENAMEL (HOME DEPOT)

\$34 (per gallon) Self-priming and superb at hiding and resisting scrubbing, this paint was also one of the few satins that was very good at resisting stains. It left a smooth finish and stood up to rough cleaning. homedepot.com



BEHR PREMIUM PLUS ULTRA MATTE (HOME DEPOT)

\$32 (per gallon) This self-priming paint was one of the few flats that was excellent at hiding. It was also superb at resisting scrubbing. But

like all flats it's not good at resisting stains. Its finish wasn't as smooth as some. homedepot.com

This paint was among the few that were superb at hiding, leaving a smooth finish that was very good at resisting stains and excellent at resisting scrubbing, but it did get dull after rough cleaning. acehardware.com

\$68 (per gallon)

This self-priming satin paint was superb at hiding and very good at resisting stains. But its finish wasn't very smooth. And it may dull with harsh cleaning benjaminmoore.com

GOOD FLAT MATTE CHOICE FOR COVERING DARK COLORS

VALSPAR SIGNATURE MATTE (LOWE'S)

\$32 (per gallon)

Among flat and matte paints it was one of the few that was excellent at hiding, and it left a smooth finish. It is self-priming and resists scrubbing, but like just about all flats it wasn't good at resisting stains. lowes.com

SELF-PRIMING SEMIGLOSS PAINT THAT RESISTS GLOSS CHANGE

BEHR PREMIUM PLUS ULTRA SEMI-GLOSS ENAMEL (HOME DEPOT)

This high-scoring semigloss lets you skip priming and is superb at hiding and resisting scrubbing, and very good at resisting stains, with little change in sheen after rough cleaning. homedepot.com
