

## How to Use Stripes to Add Visual Interest to Any Room

Stripes are very fashionable in home décor today. With their clean lines and range of color possibilities, they add a sleek touch to any style.

Vertical stripes create the perception of height, which can make a room seem taller, while horizontal stripes create the perception of length or width thus making a room look larger.

In this room, we used a localized stripe design to create a work area within a bedroom.

The first step is to select a palette of paint colors for your stripes and the basecoat of the wall on which you'll be painting them. These are the colors we used in this room:

Walls & Trim: floral white (OC-29)

Stripes: soft chinchilla (2135-50), delightful golden (2158-30), iron mountain (2134-30), hampton green (2150-50)

Here are the steps we followed:

- 1. Paint the wall with *floral white (OC-29)* and allow to dry.
- 2. Determine the widths of the stripes and draw the overall design out on paper or on computer illustration software.
- 3. Apply tape vertically on the wall. (Use high-quality painter's tape to prevent the paint from peeling off when it's removed.)
- 4. Eye ball or use a level to ensure the lines are even.
- 5. Apply the paint, using a small roller and tray set for each color. Start with the widest stripe and end with the narrowest. Two coats are often necessary to achieve the maximum depth of color.
